Future of the Law Institute Code of Conduct

Space in the FLI program is limited and the application process is competitive. The purpose of the program is to provide students with an opportunity to explore new skills, acquire knowledge about career opportunities, and gain experience as future college students and legal professionals. To ensure that students are accountable to one another and respectful of the opportunity to participate, all applicants must commit to the following to be accepted.

If I am selected for the FLI program I will take personal responsibility for the following:

- 1. Attendance. I will attend both days of the Two-Day Institute unless I have made other arrangements with the FLI program coordinator. I will arrive on time and ready to participate.
 - i. If I sign up for a field trip or a job shadow, I understand that I am taking a limited space and another student may not be able to participate. I will take responsibility for making sure that my school's requirements for field trips and absences have been met so that I can attend any field trip or job shadow for which I register.
 - ii. If utilizing bus transportation through the FLI program, I will arrive at least 10 minutes prior to the bus departure time and I will check for last minute bus schedule changes sent by the program coordinator.
 - iii. I understand that my unexcused absence from any portion of the Two-Day Institute and/or any field trip or job shadow for which I register may result in my dismissal from the program, and that I may be ineligible for a FLI scholarship.
- 2. **Respect.** I understand that participation in FLI is a privilege. I understand that many professionals from the community have expended hundreds of hours to coordinate and provide this program for my benefit. I will be attentive during the program, and treat all speakers, volunteers, and fellow students with respect. I will not use my cell phone for any reason except during scheduled breaks.
- 3. **Communication.** I understand that FLI program coordinators will communicate with me through the email I provided on my application. I will monitor that email and will respond promptly to information sent to me by the FLI program coordinator. I further understand that this is how I will be informed of program requirements and changes. Information regarding the program will also be posted on the FLI website and updated as scheduling changes are made.
